# U.S. NAVAL SEA CADET CORPS

### Who we are

We are a federally chartered non-profit civilian youth training organization, for young people ages 10 through 17. We are sponsored by the Navy League of the United States and supported by the U.S. Navy and Coast Guard.

- The goals of our program are to:
  - Develop an interest and ability in seamanship and seagoing skills.
  - Instill principles of good citizenship and strong moral principles.
  - Demonstrate the value of an alcohol-, drugand gang-free lifestyle.
  - Expose cadets to the prestige of a military career.







#### TWO PROGRAMS - ONE MISSION

Our mission is to "to encourage and aid American youth to develop, train them in seagoing skills, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance and kindred virtues..."

#### Our two programs:

- Navy League Cadet Corps (NLCC) our junior program, ages 10 through 13 (and 7<sup>th</sup> grade and below) is **Training Ship Roosevelt**. This program introduces cadets to naval life through instruction in basic seamanship and leadership
- Naval Sea Cadet Corps (NSCC) our senior program, ages 13 through 17 (and 8<sup>th</sup> grade and higher) is FD Roosevelt Squadron. This program exposes cadets to the full rigors of a military training program.







## 4 Primary Activities

- Drills Academic year meet at NAS Jacksonville. 1-2 overnight drills throughout the year.
- Online Coursework for promotion and advancement
- Summer/Winter Training 5 to14 day overnight training beginning with "boot camp"
- Extra activities community service and color guard International Exchange program





## Sea Cadet Calendar Cycle

#### **Fall**

Conduct drills 1-2 per month, with required certifications included (swim qualifications, PT test, Sexual Harassment, Drug and Alcohol Awareness, bullying awareness), plus at least one overnight or camping drill, volunteer event, recruitment and fundraising opportunities are placed in addition to regular drill schedule (K-9 for Warriors, car wash, Elks lodge cleanup, Jax Air Show, Color Guard, etc.), hold end of year picnic.

#### Winter

Plan and host recruit and advanced trainings over the winter holiday to help cadets promote to next level. These can be from 9-14 days and involve hosting more than 100 cadets from around the southeast US.

#### **Spring**

Conduct drills 1-2 per month, required national certifications (swim and PT are conducted twice a year), and additionally hold Annual Inspection, summer training preparation and perform individual coursework and advising review for advancement), end of year party.

#### **Summer**

No drills are held anywhere in the nation in the summer so that cadets can attend one or more of the hundreds of training opportunities held nationwide. After early June, the cadets will not formally report again until late August. Trainings include: basic recruit training (boot camp) but also, Master at Arms, Scuba certification, onboard sea training like the USCG Eagle, Rappelling, culinary arts, Corpsman/medical training, Religious Specialist, survival and field ops, sailing, Port Operations, Firefighting, Basic and Advanced Airman school, Air Traffic Control.



# Our Summer/Winter Training program – unmatched in opportunity, variety and depth of learning

- League Cadets have the option to attend a one-week, away from home orientation.
- Sea Cadets attend a mandatory two-week recruit training.

After recruit training is complete, cadets have the opportunity to participate in a wide variety of training sessions





## **Uniforms and Conduct**

- Uniforms: Our cadets are authorized to wear the Navy uniform appropriately marked with NSCC or NLCC insignia. Cadets learn the proper care of their uniforms and wear them with pride.
- Conduct: Cadets are taught to maintain discipline and bearing. Cadets are accountable for their actions.





## Training the next generation of leaders

- Through our advancement system, cadets have many opportunities to lead groups of their peers.
- Advanced training pushes cadets to expect the best from themselves and from others.
- Cadets participate in life in the unit as well as in the public through Honor & Ceremonial Guard and parade opportunities as well as community service projects.






#### **CONVENIENT ONLINE TOOLS**

After enrolling, each cadet will receive a Sea Cadet ID number which they will use to create their online Quarterdeck portal (Remember: they must have a unique email account from parent/quardian to open their account). Through the Quarterdeck, you and your cadet can track their progress including awards and ribbons, request to sign up for trainings, and complete coursework for promotion.









The Parent Portal account – where you complete your cadet's confidential medical and personal information, complete tasks, and to see your cadet's progress, and more.




#### **Drills & Information**

- Drill schedule posted online at www.fdrseacadets.org
- 2 Times per month, typically a Saturday from 0730 to 1600
- Camping/overnight drills will be only drill in a month
- Plan of the Day ("POD") posted a week or more prior to drill. Cadet learn to read the POD in advance and be prepared with the proper uniforms and equipment.
- Pick up and drop off be on time! Do not be the cause of your cadet being late!
- Information about uniforms, how to rank up, coursework, how to sign up for trainings - all on website and in your Parent Portal and Cadet Quarterdeck.

Support them - but do NOT do it for them.
